In May, HB was able to raise over \$6,000 for our LGBTQ+ patients and clients during the national Give OUT Day campaign, largely thanks to Joanna's offer to match small donations under \$20.

What made her do this? "We'd agreed as a Board to look into giving at the end of the fiscal year, and I worked with the

Development team to see how I could support the Give OUT Day campaign, which I'd been involved with during my time on the Emerging Leaders Council.

On **July 12,** Health Brigade was invited to give a demonstration to a group called the Partnership for the Future on sexual health education and contraceptive concepts.


The presentation was led by HB's **Ernest Charles,** phlebotomist and medical assistant.
